Marian Knight, 440 W. Main St - #5 Why require people to find representatives of the opposing views if they are in favor of an item? Why do opposing view speakers get twice as long as those in favor? Why is there a 30 minute time limit? Rather, the chair call an end to public comment that goes on and on with a 30 minute minimum prior to ending public comment. Changes add additional restrictions and will make it likely that the changes could be used in the future to suppress the right of people to speak. Presented an alternative to the Ordinance and suggested that the presented ordinance not pass in its current form.

Carmen Lichty – Concerned with only allowing people to speak to what's on the agenda. No opportunity to speak on other items.

Mike Foley, 318 Oak Vista Drive - #1 Concerned that items not on the agenda will be excluded from public comments.

Analysis was conducted by Brad Peters, P.E., UT MTAS Public Works Consultant Recommendation: "Given the lack of vehicular accidents, an analysis of the traffic data during both study periods (June 28, 2023 & August 25, 2023), and field observations, it is our recommendation that the town leave the intersection in its current configuration, as suggested by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices".

Upgrade Tasers for Police Dept to X10's

Via \$46,000 Violent Crimes Grant (old X26 model tasers are no longer supported), originally applied to order Taser 7's. X10's are \$6,000 more than original order of X7's. (X10's are more accurate, 10 individual shots, green laser, 45' vs 25' distance, audible tone, LED strobe, uses gun powder, 250'/second velocity, replace probes only, cannot dry tase) Total Upgrade = \$48,242.97

It came on a motion by Alderman ELDER, seconded by Alderman REESE, to purchase the X10 Tasers for the additional \$6,000 (\$46,000 grant, \$6,000 fund balance)

• Bid – 2020 CDBG I&I Sewer System Improvements Sewer Line Extension (Replace sewer line behind the Jefferson County Sheriff Workhouse to Nichols Road)

Bids were opened on 9/7/23, significant price increases, \$1,165,170 (\$87,000 original construction budget). \$905,250 deficit via DWMF funds. Recommend to table this item for one month to allow time to seek other alternative funding.

It was consensus to table this item for 1 month.

• Discuss Guidelines for Erosion Control

Issues with erosion control on city streets, currently no policy to recoup time/expense (hourly rate, equipment use) when employees are dispatched to clean up city streets (including after hours), especially safety problems created by negligent property owners.

It came on a motion by Alderman ELDER, seconded by Alderman REESE, to have the Town Attorney to devise an ordinance to be presented at the next meeting to include charges for fees.

On a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously, and was so ordered.

• Discuss Guidelines for Sidewalk Repair

Issues with damage to existing sidewalks. Costs to charge contractors/utilities/homeowners for public works to repair damaged sidewalk. Public Works Superintendent will seek estimates on cost of concrete and add 30%. An ordinance will be written and presented at next months meeting.
