 Second and Final Reading of Ordinance No. 23/24-21 Amending the "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Dandridge, TN" by Amending Section 14-603, Allowing Gun Sales As A Home Occupation

**Town Administrator Shockley** – Comes as a recommendation from planning commission and establishes gun sales as an allowable use as home occupation and requires FFL-1 License obtained through the ATF.

• First Reading of **Ordinance No. 23/24-22** Establishing Regulations for "Short Term Rentals" withing the Corporate Limits of the Town of Dandridge, TN

**Town Administrator Shockley** – comes from discussion from this board. Will set new requirements for any and all short-term rentals within the town. Establishes consistent measures to ensure the safety of patrons of these rentals.

# Highlights:

- o Need to set effective date
- o Requires application and inspection from building inspector and fire marshall
- o Requires smoke alarms, fire extinguishers, and carbon monoxide monitors
- o House numbers visible from street
- o Three types of permits: Owner, Non-Owner, Non-Occupied
- o Initial Fee of \$350, Renewal \$100

<u>It came on a motion by Alderman REESE, seconded by Mayor GANTTE, to approve Ordinance No. 23/24-22 on first reading.</u>

**Town Attorney Jeff Greene** – effective date is 30 days from passage of ordinance. Can extend to 60 days. Under this ordinance, If there are two residents per lot, only 1 can be used for short-term rental including duplexes.

• **Resolution No. 23/24-15** Authorizing the Town of Dandridge, TN to Submit for and Accept Appalachian Regional Commission Funds for Sewer System Improvements

**Town Administrator Shockley** – Resolution signifying interest in applying 2024 ARC Grant. \$1,000,000 grant that requires a 50/50 match. Used to continue sewer upgrades in the system. This is the first step of applying for grant. This will be for new projects, focusing on 417 area.

It came on a motion by Mayor Gantte, seconded by Alderman REESE, to approve Resolution No. 23/24-15

Resolution No. 23/24-16 Amending and Revising the Town of Dandridge, TN Personnel Handbook

**Town Administrator Shockley** – Thanks to Kendall, Cathy, and MTAS for work on handbook update. Contains multiple deletions of policies, these will be removed and put in policies and procedures manual.

# Highlights:

- o Defines at-will employment
- Clarifies hiring procedures to attract best candidates
- Allows Town Administrator to negotiate pay with department heads or employees required to have certain certifications to a fair market value
- o Clarifies overtime/holiday
- o Clarifies designated day the holidays are paid on

It came on a motion by Alderman DEPEW, seconded by Alderman ELDER, to roll to next meeting

# X. OLD BUSINESS

Discussion of Property on Graveyard Alley

Town Building Inspector Terry Reneau — Cost for professional fees to develop property \$33,500. Would cover architectural, structural, civil, and any geo services (survey). Old hardware store owner approached mayor about purchasing the property. Would board want to entertain selling? Intentions would be to clean it up and put picnic tables. The public wouldn't be allowed to use the property if sold. Would work with town during activities. Narrowing the scope would be helpful in obtaining accurate numbers.

The board shows no interest in selling the property and would like to see other quotes on engineering services.

Alderman Reese – proposes using same plans from bathroom facility on TVA property.

Vice Mayor Kesterson – Proposes using the same plan from Public Launch, trying to duplicate to make a bigger bathroom facility.

Alderman Elder – Proposes using hotel/motel tax for funding of project since it is tourism related.

Mayor Gantte – Maybe look at other examples of pre-fab (Cherokee) Vice Mayor Kesterson (Jeff City Pool)

#### XI. NEW BUSINESS

• Approval to Purchase Drum Screen (DWMF) (\$423,900.00)

**Town Administrator Shockley** – originally budgeted \$300,000. Have realized some savings elsewhere \$35,500 on sewer camera and \$43,000 on jetter trailer. Drum screen is first line of defense for sewer plant. Current screen is outdated and no longer supported by manufacturer. New screen has a 20 year life cycle. Additional money would come out of DWMF operating budget.

It came on a motion by Mayor GANTTE, seconded by Alderman REESE, to Approve the Purchase of the Drum Screen for \$423,900

• Approval to Purchase SCBA Air Fill Station from Municipal Emergency Services Utilizing Sourcewell Contract (\$64,692.00) and Surplus Existing Equipment to Chesnutt Hill Fire Dept.

*Chief Riley* – Budgeted \$50,250 for purchase. Additional funding will come from fire department operating account. Value of old system is \$7,500.

It came on a motion by Mayor GANTTE, seconded by Alderman REESE, to Approve the Purchase of SCBA Air Fill Station from Municipal Emergency Services Utilizing Sourcewell Contract (\$64,692.00) and Surplus Existing Equipment to Chesnutt Hill Fire Dept.

 Approval to Replace/Repair Garage Bay Doors At Dandridge Fire Station #1 by Overhead Garage Door. (\$8,704.00)

Chief Riley – Side bay door is the last original door in the building and needs replaced. Overhead Door Company has been out several times to temporarily repair the door to keep it somewhat functional. Quote is also to repair the door panel where the dodge truck parks, get weatherstripping back up around the doors. Tried to get 3 quotes but has only been able to get 1 quote from Overhead Door Company.

It came on a motion by Alderman REESE, seconded by Alderman DEPEW, to Approve the Purchase of New Side Bay Door and Other Door Repairs for \$8,704

**Town Administrator Shockley** – Budgeted \$10,000 for item. Was able to obtain 3 bids and this was the lowest price and best availability. Will surplus the last remaining 2004 Steiner at the Field of Dreams. Difference in budgeted price will come from general fund
